

Fifty years of Girl Scouting in the United States

The first Girl Scout troop was organized in Savannah, Georgia, on March 12, 1912 by Juliette Low. She was a friend and colleague of Sir Robert Baden-Powell (later Lord Baden-Powell) and his sister Miss Agnes Baden-Powell who founded the Boy Scout and Girl Guide movements in England a few years previously. Mrs. Low had served as the leader of Girl Guide "companies" in London and Scotland and knew first hand the responsibilities and rewards of this vital volunteer role.

The Scouting idea caught on quickly with American girls so that within a short time there were many troops and a National Headquarters was established in Washington, D. C. The National Organization was incorporated in June of 1915. Today Girl Scout membership totals three and one half million girls and adults. During the five decades since the first troop was organized, more than 18 million girls and women have been active in Scouting.

Basic to Girl Scouting is the Promise "On my honor, I will try: To do my duty to God and my country, To help other people at all times, To obey the Girl Scout Laws." As Girl Scouting moves into its next fifty years girls can look forward to a program which is designed to meet the needs of girls growing up in the second half of the Twentieth Century.
