

cachets and fdc's. I was surprised to find out from a local stamp dealer that first day covers don't need the cachet (a design or inscription on the envelope, usually located on the left side, to commemorate a postal or philatelic event) to be considered first day covers.

(Editor's Note: This is true, because the post offices designated for the first day of issue will use the first day cancellation on all mail as requested. However, most collectors prefer printed or engraved cachets that honor the event. If you are artistic you might try drawing your own.)

SCOUTS DELIVER Shortly after Bangladesh declared its independence from Pakistan in 1971, the Muki Fouz (the Bengali independence forces) set up postal services in districts under their control. In areas where there was little danger of attack from Pakistani forces, Scouts were used to deliver the mail. The mail carried by the Scouts had a number of special markings and cancellations. The postal operations were returned to civilian control after the war.-\$5 to Mark Hughes, Villa Park, Ill.
