Robert Baden-Powell was a British hero following his outstanding military service in Africa in the early 1900s. During his military days he wrote a manual for his regiment that gave instructions for survival in the wild. When he discovered that young boys were interested in reading his material, Baden-Powell rewrote the manual as a nonmilitary skill book which he titled *Scouting for Boys*. Baden-Powell's book and the idea of Scouting was becoming equally popular in the United States. A Chicago publisher, William D. Boyce, was visiting London and became lost in a dense fog. A Scout helped him find his way and refused to take a tip for doing a Good Turn. Boyce was so impressed with the boy that he met with Baden-Powell and then incorporated the Boy Scouts of America (BSA) in 1910.

The three "Aims of Scouting" are character development, citizenship training, and personal fitness. These are achieved by various methods, including patrols (which give responsibility to individual Scouts as well as provide interaction in small groups), outdoor programs, rewards for achievements and advancement through ranks, association with positive adult role models, community service projects, leadership training and development, and a uniform which shows commitment, purpose, and accomplishments.

The BSA holds a national Scout jamboree every four years. Valley Forge, Pennsylvania was the site for the 1950 National Scout Jamboree. In 1997, the most recent Jamboree, the site was Fort A.P. Hill, Virginia.







As to the pictured cachet, it is all of a reddish-orange color except the three top lines of type which appear in black. The cachet itself is fully printed - not handstamped - and was produced in a limited quantity by the Aloha Council, Boy Scouts of America, located in Honolulu, Hawaii. It is believed that less than 100 were made (possibly less than 50) and were sent as a recognition to large financial contributors to the Council. However, no one in present day Scouting on the Islands seems to know the addressee - Mrs. Juliette Guard.

The envelopes (whatever amount there were?) were typed at the Council Offices and were carried to the National Jamboree by Scout leaders. There, the stamps were purchased and applied, and the covers were posted in special mail boxes for ultimate delivery.

The association of Norman Rockwell began with Boy's life in 1913, an opportunity that launched Norman Rockwell into his successful career in illustration.

At the End of four years, Norman Rockwell had completed over two hundred illustrations for Boy's life.

After a break of a few years from Scout illustrations, Norman Rockwell instituted a tradition, begun in 1924 and continued for fifty-two years until 1976. He was approached by Boy's Life to do a yearly calendar illustration for them which would also be published as the February cover of the magazine. His last calendar was for the Bicentennial Celebration.

The first frame of my exhibit is a showing of US Stamp #995, Boy Scout stamp. year 1950. The following pages show First Day Covers with cover write ups. Besides page write ups there are footnotes to show the covers' part of the Scout story.

This special stamp was issued in honor of the Boy Scouts of America.

The stamp is 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, arranged horitzontally, printed by the rotary process in brown, electriceye perforated. Stamps was designed by Frederic A. Bartholdi, a Mason.

BOY SCOUTS OF AMERICA


The Boy Scouts of America is part of a worldwide scouting organization founded in Great Britain in 1908 by Lieutenant General Sir Robert Baden-Powell. The movement was introduced to the United States two years later by Chicago publisher William D. Boyce. After being helped to find his way through the London fog by a British scout, Boyce became interested in promoting the ideals of scouting in this country.

On February 8, 1910, the Boy Scouts of America came into being in Washington, D.C. The organization was closely modeled after its British counterpart, sharing the same goals, laws and motto. In 1916, America's Scouts were federally chartered by the U.S. Congress. The universal appeal of the program for boys soon caused it to spread to all parts of the country. American Boy Scouts held their first national jamboree in 1937.

The National Council is responsible for the functioning of the Boy Scouts of America, which is comprised of more than 140,000 Scout units. Each unit adheres to the basic principles of cooperation with local community institutions and volunteer leadership. In order to be chartered to carry out the scouting program, local sponsors (most often churches) agree to provide a meeting place, capable leaders and financial supervision.


Scouting aims to build character, citizenship and physical and mental fitness through programs of work and play. The Boy Scouts of America offers three such programs: Cub Scouts for youngsters 8 to 10 years old, Boy Scouts for ages 11 through 17, and Explorers, for high school students or boys at least 15 years old. The programs become increasingly self-governing as Scouts advance in age and classification. Total membership in the Boy Scouts of America is almost four million boys and 1.5 million adult leaders.

Noted illustrator Norman Rockwell designed the 4ε stamp which honors the 50th anniversary of the Boy Scouts of America. First Day of Issue was February 8, 1960 in Washington, D.C.

How Scouting Came to America

It was on a very foggy day in 1909, that William D. Boyce, an American publisher, was searching for an address in old London. All day long the city had been covered with a heavy fog. Street lights had been turned on before noon. Now night was coming on, and it was almost impossible for the stranger to find his way.

Mr. Boyce was surprised when a boy approached and asked if he might be of service. He told the boy where he wanted to go, and was more surprised when the boy saluted him, and said, "Come with me sir."

Upon reaching the address, Mr. Boyce reached into his pocket and offered the boy a shilling. He was more surprised than ever when the boy refused it. "No thank you, sir. I'm a Scout. Scouts do not accept tips for Good Turns."


"Good Turns? Scouts?" asked Mr. Boyce "What are the Scouts?"

The boy told him, and showed him the way to Baden-Powell's office nearby. There, Mr. Boyce found out about the Boy Scouts, and decided that American boys would like the great game of Scouting.












Scout badge. The shape of the complete Scout badge, which is also on the Class badge of rank, was adapted from the north point of an old mariner's compass. The design is often called a trefoil - a flower with three leaves. It is also known by its French name, fleur-de-lis - lily or iris flower. The shape resembles an arrowhead.


With slight changes, the trefoil badge is used by Scouts around the world.







This special stamp was issued to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the founding of the Boy Scouts of America. On February 8, 1910 the Boy Scouts of America were officially incorporated in the District of Columbia.

The 4-cent Boy Scouts of America Golden Jubilee commemorative stamp, measuring 0.84 by 1.44 inches in dimension, arranged horizontally, was printed on the Giori presses and issued in panes of 50.







The 6-cent airmail postal card saluting the Boy Scouts' XII World Jamboree will be first placed on sale on August 4, 1967, at Farragut State Park, Idaho, where Scouts from nearly one hundred nations and territories will be encamped.

This airmail card is valid for postage to Canada and Mexico, in addition to all points in the United States and it's possessions. It may be used to send messages to other by affixing adhesive stamp to meet the required rate.

Stevan Dohanos, a member of the Citizens' Stamp Advisory Committee, designed the stamp on the card. It is based on the Jamboree patch, which shows the fleur-de-lis emblem of Scouting and Borah Peak, the highest point in Idaho, the host state to the Scouts.

Ten million cards will be printed by the Government Printing Office in two runs on a two-color offset, press blending yellow, blue, red and black inks. Maximum blending occurs in the fleur-de-lis in which the bronze color is achieved by interspersing half-tone dots in the four inks.

Youth Commemorative Stamps


A block of four 22-cent commemorative stamps featuring youth organizations was issued October 7. In Chicago, Illinois. The dedication ceremony was conducted at Chicago's Hotel Continental during the International Youth Services Conference. The stamps were issued in conjunction with the United Nations' celebration of "International Youth Year."

Represented on the block of four stamps are the Boy Scouts, Big Brothers/Big Sisters, Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA) Youth Camping and Camp Fire. Artist Dennis Luzak used an interesting approach in executing the four designs. The top two stamps in the block of four feature the same hillside scene in the background, while the lower two each feature the same riverbank scene.

The YMCA Youth Camping stamp, situated in the Upper left corner of the block, depicts four individuals with backgacks tiking, and the adjacent stamp features two Boy Scouts stepping down from some rocks. The Big Brothers/Big Sisters stamp, in the lower left corner, depicts a man and woman with a boy and girl standing on the riverbank, and the Camp Fire stamp portrays two youngsters paddling a canoe past a campground on shore.

Each of the youth groups represented by the block of four stamps provides young men and women with excellent opportunities to participate in a wide variety of character developing programs.
