Scout First Day Covers. As a service to readers of "About Stamps," we have secured an additional supply of maximum cards of the four Liechtenstein Boy Scout stamps of 1953, autographed by Prince Emanuel, Chief Scout of that country, and postmarked on the opening day of the international conference.

The price is \$1.25 per card. Also available are some Cuban Boy Scout stamp first day covers at 35¢ each for a cover and a single mint stamp, or 26¢ for lots of six or more. Scout Stamps of the World.

The 1955 revised edition of the booklet *Boy Scout Stamps of the World* has just come off the press along with a companion booklet, *Boy Scout Fund Seals and Camp Stamp Posts*. Both books were written by your stamp editor and Harry D. Thorsen, Jr. The first book contains illustrated descriptions and stories of all stamps issued in honor of the Boy Scout movement. The other is a compilation of pictures of stamps used by displaced persons in Europe

Boy Scout Stamp. A five-cent green and gold horizontal stamp was issued in August by Canada to commemorate the Eighth World Jamboree, which was held that month at Niagara-on-the-Lake, Ontario.
