Boy Scout First Days

There are now more than 1,000 Scout and leader members of SOSSI who collect Scout stamps. Most of these collectors also prefer FDC cacheted, if possible, for each Scout stamp issued. The earliest Scout stamps of Czechoslovakia 1918, Siam 1920, Hungary 1925 and Romania 1931 had few covers on first day dates and almost no interest in this collecting area was shown until 1937. At this time, the Netherlands and the Dutch East Indies issue FDC sponsored by the 5th World Scout Jamboree in Holland, an air-lines company in the "Indies," and a few individual designs (in small quantities).

Scout cacheted FDC fall into three large groups, if you agree that there must be a postage stamp honoring or depicting Scouting, and an accepted date and location for the cancellation:

- I. Official Scout FDC: These are sponsored by the Scout organizations, either local or national, and usually are for the purpose of raising funds for Scouting. *Example: Korea* 1957
- II. Philatelic Dealers FDC: These are usually printed by professional individuals or large stamp companies in great quantities. *Example: USA* 1950 (Artmaster)
- III. Individual Cachet FDC: These are usually printed, mimeographed, rubber stamped or hand drawn in small quantities by collectors or Scout members (boy or adult). *Example: Philippines* 1948, 1959
- The various types of First Day Scout cancellations can be divided into these three groups:
 - A. Scout design, badge or lettering honoring a Scout Jamboree or Scouting event or anniversary. *Example: Brazil* 1957
 - B. Philatelic agency cancel common to many FDC of the country of issue. *Example*: *Pakistan* 1960
 - C. City, date and time known to be used on the First Day of Issue: *Example*: Cuba 1957

not issuing the stamps and usually long after the First Day of Issue. One dealer prints the same design with different colors and wording. He evidently purchases quantities of the covers on plain envelopes, then determines the imprinting later according to the popularity. Most Scout collectors reject these cachets when known.

The most popular FDC for Scouts include a Scout stamp, Scout cancel, Scout cachet and Scout label or seal. However, the cachet may be applied with a rubber stamp by a Boy Scout at a Jamboree and be considered more worthy and interesting than the best

printed envelope in four color process by dealers.

Values of FDC seem to be very much in proportion to the quantity and the design of the cachet. However, premiums are placed upon covers with Jamboree cancellations rather than just any city if there are various locations of First Day Covers.

Autographed Scout First Day Covers

In a recent issue of FIRST DAYS mention was made of a double hobby, collecting autographed First Day Covers. This has been a pleasant combination for collectors of Scout covers, in that a personal relationship is necessary either by letter or by interview in order to request the signature of important people.

While there can be many possible selections of famous names to appear on most covers, I believe that the Scouting interests will place the Chief Scout of any country at the head of the list for popularity in this field. However, the president or king of a country is always an interesting autograph, especially if he is also the honorary head of the Scouts in his own land.

In 1949 when Japan issued their stamp illustrated here on a FDC, their Chief was visiting our national headquarters where his signature was requested. The Prince of Liechtenstein autographed the cover shown when your author met him in 1955 at the World Jamboree in Canada. The fact that his own picture in Scout uniform appears on the cachet certainly increases the interest in this card.

The 1954 Cuban cover has the actual signatures of the Boy Scout and the Cub Scout who appear on the stamp and on the cachet. Bill Rhee, Chief of the Korean Scouts, was a visitor in 1956 to your author's home, where this Scout stamp and cover were planned.

Many different possibilities exist that should lead to the use of the collectors' imagination. Whether the cover is really more valuable should not be the consideration. Rather, the personal satisfaction of knowing whether the autographs are genuine should be the collectors reward as well as having "one of a kind."
