

# Scouts on Stamps

The international scouting movement had its origins during the Boer War in South Africa, when Colonel Robert Baden-Powell enlisted young military cadets as "scouts" during the siege of the town of Mafeking. One of the emergency stamps issued during the siege (below) shows cadet scout Warner Goodyear on a bicycle, delivering mail among the many small outposts around the town.



After the war, Baden-Powell was inspired in 1907 to create a program in Britain for the development of young men – "the scouting movement."

Three years later, on February 8, 1910, William D. Boyce founded the Boy Scouts of America, which over the last 100 years has helped many young men develop their citizenship and leadership skills.

The first U.S. stamp honoring the Boy Scouts appeared in 1950 and is featured on the cover of this program and on this year's Knoxpex 2010 cachet. A commemorative stamp was issued in 1960 on the 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Boy Scouts.



Another stamp, shown below, appeared in 1985, and a postal card was issued at the 1967 World Jamboree.
