

#### AUTHOR'S INTRODUCTION

This booklet may come as a surprise to some philatelists because of the amount of material available for collection in what, at first glance, appears to be a comparatively limited field. The general collector has few occasions to come in contact with much of the topical specialists' so-called "bread and butter". Those who are not Scouts on Stamps enthusiasts are probably familiar with little beyond the 1950 Boy Scout commemorative issue. To them, this work should provide interest and revelation.

To Boy Scout topicalists, however, this booklet should prove to be a welcome and long awaited addition to their philatelic library and a helpful and desireable catalogue and guide. Items from their own collections will be immediately recognized. Pictures and descriptions of other items will enable the collector to continue his search with a real knowledge of what he is trying to find.

Some few advanced (or lucky) Scout collectors may discover sufficient gaps herein-through comparison with their own collections—to cause some disconcertion. To them, I can only offer my profuse apologies; point out the difficulties involved in assembling the varied material; and hopefully suggest that they can be of great service in making a future edition much more complete by informing me of any omissions that they note.

A sincere effort has been made, with the help of some interested individuals--who will be enumerated hereafter--to gather in this volume all of the known Boy Scout cachets that were produced in the United States from the time of the inception of the Boy Scout movement in this country in 1910. One-of-a-kind rarities have been omitted intentionally, since the listing of material that is completely unavailable and uncollectable would seem to have little purpose or value.

Intensive research has uncovered much interesting information concerning various of the cachets presented, but one category of data has defied investigation in many instances; namely, the number of cacheted covers of any particular kind that were issued. Advice along this line, as to any item thus deficient, would be sincerely appreciated.

It should also be noted that no attempt has been made to place an unrealistic catalog value upon any of the covers. Their demand has always exceeded their supply. The prices vary from month to month, from dealer to dealer, and from collector to collector. However, no listed cover would normally retail for less than \$.25, and many would run into a few dollars or more. Nevertheless, many 5¢ & 10¢ bargains have been found by intensive search through large cover lots. This, perhaps, is one of the lures of collecting Scouts on Stamps cacheted covers.

All in all, this catalogue has been somewhat of a joint effort by various members the Scouts on Stamps Society International, and acknowledgement and thanks must be given, for both their moral and material support, to the following persons, listed alphabetically: Willard H. The author fully recognizes the imperfections herein. He is, however, satisfied that a long-needed beginning has now been made towards filling what has heretofore been a serious void in the Scout collector's store of knowledge. He hopes that in this, at least, you will agree.

#### HOW TO COLLECT CACHETED SCOUT COVERS

One of the interesting and attractive features of collecting Scouts on Stamps items is the intensive search necessary to uncover even a few of these elusive articles. The longer the battle; the sweeter the victory. The longer the search; the more satisfying the find--maxims even truer when dealing with Scout cachets of the United States. Nevertheless, hidden treasures are waiting to be unearthed; quick profits or a commanding position in trading are the fruits to be gained by the discoverers of duplicates. But be forewarned! The feint of heart and the easily discouraged must surely fail.

As a practical matter, there remain only few worthwhile sources for this sort of material. The run-of-the-mill dealer will usually have nothing on hand along these lines, but will be glad to reminisce with you about the good old days when he was "loaded" with Scout offerings. If such a dealer does manage to get hold of some cacheted Scout covers, he has a waiting list of favored customers to whom he can peddle what he has at exorbitant prices. Some dealers, who specialize in first day and other types of covers, do have basic Scout cachets in their stock. Many offer them for sale (either in person or on approval) at comparatively fair prices, even though their supply is limited. Others, however, cognizant of the terrific demand for even such basic items, have marked the prices up beyond all reasonable bounds. The Scout collector should be wary of such persons.

Be not completely discouraged, however. There are still, at least, four good methods of adding interesting and valuable Scout cachets of the United States to your collection. One obvious means is to bid competitively at recognized auctions on large cover lots in which you have fortunately found a few Scout covers. (And a few is usually all that you will find, if that. Blind bidding will, therefore, be quite disappointing.)

The second procedure is a comparatively simple one. By following the news items in your favorite philatelic magazine or newspaper (or in the Scouts on Stamps Society International Journal), you will be able to learn about the forthcoming special cacheted Scout covers. You will then be able to purchase them, direct from the original source, at from 10¢ to 20¢ a piece -- quite reasonable.

Trading is the third process by which Scout cachets can be obtained. Normal trading local stamp clubs will usually produce poor results, since this type of material is not in general circulation. However, by joining the Scouts on Stamps topical society, you will be advised as to when groups of philatelists, who specialize in Scout stamps and covers, will be meeting in your locality. Attendance at one of these gatherings can not fail to be fruitful. Even if you are short of trading material, other Scout collectors often have duplicates for sale at exceptionally fair prices.

The final system for securing cacheted Scout covers is the most fun, the most rewarding, and, of course, the most tiring. Briefly, it consists of attending stamp shows, large and small, haunting dealer after dealer for your wants, and spending hours searching through large lots of dedication and special events covers in the hope of finding a few Scout items. In order to do this, you will have to be at the show early, make your search thorough, and beat out other Scout collectors who are doing the same thing. Nevertheless, it is by this method that worthwhile covers often can be bought quite cheaply primarily because these dealers have neither the time nor the patience to sort their stock topically.

You are probably all familiar with the ending of the Scout Oath, which reads, "...To keep myself physically strong, mentally awake, and morally straight". In your search for Scout cachets, a similar pledge would be

helpful. Happy hunting!

#### Text And Symbol Explanation

Wherever possible, information supplied as to each cachet includes:

- (1) Description of Event.
- (2) Date of Issue.
- (3) City and State of Issue (Postmark).
  - (a) The sign (#) appearing after the name of a city and state means that the same cachet exists on covers with other city and state postmarks.
- (4) Type of Cachet.
  - (a) The following symbols are used:
    - E Engraved or embossed.
    - H Hand or machine stamped.
    - M Mimeographed.
    - P Printed or lithographed.
    - S Silk-screened or hand-painted.
- (5) Colors of Cachet.
  - (a) The following symbols are used:
    - A More than five different colors.
    - B Blue, ultramarine, etc.
    - Bl Black or gray.
    - Br Brown, rust, etc.
    - G Green, olive, etc.
    - 0 Orange.
    - R Red, maroon, etc.
    - S Silver.
    - V Violet, purple, etc.
    - Y Yellow, gold, etc.

- (5) Colors of Cachet (Continued).
  - (b) Where more than one color appears on the cachet, each are listed in order of prominence.
  - (c) Where written portion of cachet is in a color different from the rest of the cachet, that color is underlined.
  - (d) Where the same cachets were produced in entirely different colors, each different color is numbered.
- (6) Approximate Number of Covers Issued.
  - (a) Where an approximate number of cacheted covers issued appears, it should, nevertheless, be noted that many of these covers often fell into the hands of non-philatelists and were destroyed or lost. Therefore, the actual number of existing covers of a particular type may be substantially less than the indicated figure.
- (7) Organization or Individual That Sponsored, Prepared or Mailed the Cacheted Cover.

#### NOTES

- 1. Some of the cachets and covers depicted hereafter have not been reproduced in their original size, but appear somewhat smaller. This has been done in order to more conveniently accommodate these cachets and covers in their appropriate order.
- 2. Where a cachet reproduction appears in a somewhat shoddy condition, it should be noted that this is not the fault of our printer, but is "as is" as the cachet was actually originally produced.
- 3. When referring to a particular cachet in correspondence, please use the number appearing with each cachet and the additional letter where appropriate.

#### **BOY SCOUT STAMP**

The 3¢ postage stamp issued June 30, 1950, to honor the work being done by the Boy Scouts of America in building character and future citizenship, is of Masonic interest. The stamp pays homage to the life work of Daniel C. Beard, a Mason, who at his death on June 11, 1941, was a member of Cornucopia Lodge No. 563, Flushing, N.Y. He led in the formation of the Boy Scouts in 1910. The stamp shows the Statue of Liberty-a beacon light of freedom to all men-which was designed by a Mason, Frederic A. Bartholdi. The statue's cornerstone was laid with Masonic ceremonies, Aug. 5, 1885, by the Grand Lodge of New York.
